An overview of 'Sathya Sai Speaks- A National Study Circle initiative for SSE teachers.'



WHY: To learn and deepen our understanding of Swami's vision for the SSE programchildren, parents and teachers.

WHAT: Since this is an SSE initiative, we will be primarily studying Swami's discourses given during balvikas (SSE) conference and/or training.

HDW: a) One discourse will be selected and each month, 2-3 paragraphs will be published with discussion questions and life application suggestions. b) The Center SSE coordinator in consultation with SSE teachers shall choose a day and time outside of the Center meeting to conduct the study circle. c) Facilitators will be selected from within the Center and on a rotation basis.

WHO: a) all SSE teachers and SSE coordinators are invited to participate. b) the national study circle team is represented by most of the regions and will be an additional resource for local Center coordinators. It is important to mention that the national team conducts the study circle first, develop discussion questions and commit to a life application prior to the publication of the discourse excerpt. On an average, the national team spends 3-5 hours to prepare each monthly study circle content (about one page).

In a discourse on 3rd March, 1974, Swami revealed a simple three step process towards self-transformation. He said, "This is the proper plan of study - reading, reflection and regular application in life. Study is WORK. Inquiry into the value and applicability of what is studied is WORSHIP; the experience of the validity and value of the practice is WISDOM. "

With His loving grace, may we be inspired to read, to reflect and to practice every day of our lives!

During Summer of 1978, the first All-India Bal Vikas Gurus training camp was conducted in Brindavan, Bangalore. Over 150 gurus attended this 6 day training camp which included lectures, discussions and Q &A with Bhagawan. Our first discourse for study, 'New version for Gurus,' is from this training camp. 

Promote Respectful Behavior to Elders

The home too must feel the change in the child's behavior. It may be advisable to gather the mother of the children once a month, or even more frequently, and give them guidelines on child care and on the higher ideals of family and social life. You can suggest to them ways and means of following up the work of the Bala Vikas in proper upbringing of children, while allowing freedom to these children at home. While allowing them due freedom, they should nevertheless hold harmful tendencies in check.

They should promote respectful behavior to elders in the family. They should be careful how they themselves behave in the presence of children, for youngsters learn a lot by emulation. A spirit of understanding and sympathy has to pervade the home. This can be emphasized with the mothers at these gatherings. This would be a necessary supplement to the Bala Vikas.

The homes in which the Bala Vikas children grow, as indeed all homes, have to be clean and with vibrations free from hatred, envy, greed, spite and hypocrisy. The food that the child takes in has to be *sathwik* (pure). Between the age of two and five the child's mind is profoundly affected by the behavior of those nearest it, so the parents must take care to set a good example. Workers, office-bearers, Gurus and Seva Dal (Service Corps) members of the Sathya Sai Organization all over the world, all must remember that they are subject to the scrutiny of the public, wherever they are and whatever they do.



They must be free from the habits and practices which they recommend others to give up. The Gurus should not leave their own children out of the Bala Vikas class; they should not lose their temper; they should keep their emotions under control and not exhibit depression, dejection or a wavering Will. The quality of work is more important than the quantity, so they should not undertake to do more than what they can render satisfactorily. Let their own conscience be the judge: if they feel that they have discharged their duty sufficiently to the children or to society, then they may rest content.

1.How can we inspire ourselves, parents and fellow SSE Gurus, to be examples to children at home and elsewhere?

2. What does Swami mean by "promoting respectful behavior"? How can parents and SSE Gurus role-model respectful behavior to our children?

3.How can the SSE Gurus discharge their duty to the best of their ability, keeping in mind Swami's teachings?
